Invitation: Blockchain X Energy Transition Policy Foresighting Workshop

GI would like to invite you to participate in a policy foresighting workshop focused on blockchain development in the energy sector.

This intensive workshop will provide you with an understanding of the many possible trajectories that policy planning can take with respect to blockchain development in the energy market. Our aim is to help your organization refine its long-term preparedness strategy toward potential disruption, while continuing to successfully navigate the energy transition.

Drawing upon the combined expertise of participants from varied fields, ranging from energy distribution and ICT to energy policy, the group will co-design scenarios and develop an adaptive policy pathway to a blockchain-accelerated energy transition.

During the workshop, participants will work through the following three questions:

- 1. Which applications of distributed ledger technology (DLT) hold the highest potential to accelerate the energy transition?
- 2. Which drivers (regulatory, normative, market) and emerging trends may influence the developmental outcomes of these applications?
- 3. What are the governance implications for each stakeholder, in a DLT-enabled energy transition?

MORE ABOUT THE WORKSHOPS

These workshops are part of a joint research project between CGI Rotterdam and the Copernicus Institute for Sustainable Development, Utrecht University. They will be facilitated by Valentina Nakic, a graduate trainee working with CGI Rotterdam's Utilities, Oil and Gas, and Communications teams, and Master's student of Sustainable Development at Utrecht University.

Combined knowledge of blockchain and the energy sector is not a prerequisite for participation. Pre-workshop consultation calls with each participant will be conducted by the CGI project representative, followed by an email brief that will be sent across with the key information needed to gain maximum value from the workshops.
